# 2020 General Election: Tuesday, Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup>

- Voter Registration Deadlines:
  - Postmarked by 10/09 (25 days prior), received by 10/14
- Early Voting: nine (9) days before every election in NY
  - Saturday 10/24 - Sunday 11/01; times differ each day
- Deadline to request Absentee Ballot:
  - By mail: 10/27 - 7 days before Election Day
  - In-person: 11/02 - 1 day before Election Day
- Deadline to return an Absentee Ballot
  - By mail: postmarked by 11/03, received by 11/10
  - In person: by 9:00pm on Election Day, Tuesday 11/03

# 2 Ways to Register to Vote in NYC

- NYC Votes Turbovote: [nycvotes.turbovote.org](https://nycvotes.turbovote.org)
- Fully online: currently, only online way is through the DMV:  
[dmv.ny.gov/mydmv/](https://dmv.ny.gov/mydmv/)
  - Requires having updated NYS drivers' license, permit, or non-drivers ID
- Paper Form - most common
  - Download and print your own from NYC Board of Elections: [vote.nyc](https://vote.nyc)
  - Pick up from a BOE office





# NY Voter Registration Form

## Catch-all form for all purposes:

- Register to vote for the first time ever *OR* first time anywhere in NY state
- Update your name *OR* address for your voter registration
- Become a member of a political party
- Change your political party affiliation
- ‘Pre-register’ to vote if you are 16 or 17 years of age



# NY State Eligibility Requirements

- Citizen of the United States
- 18 years old by election day to vote
  - 18 before the end of the year to register
  - Pre-registration for 16- and 17-year olds
- Not be in prison or on parole for a felony conviction (unless parole pardoned or restored rights of citizenship)
- Not claim a right to vote elsewhere
- Not found to be incompetent by a court



# Registering to vote



## New York State Voter Registration Form

### Register to vote

With this form, you register to vote in elections in New York State. You can also use this form to:

- change the name or address on your voter registration
- become a member of a political party
- change your party membership
- pre-register to vote if you are 16 or 17 years of age

### To register you must:

- be a US citizen;
- be 18 years old (you may pre-register at 16 or 17 but cannot vote until you are 18);
- not be in prison or on parole for a felony conviction (unless parole pardoned or restored rights of citizenship);
- not claim the right to vote elsewhere;
- not found to be incompetent by a court.

### Send or deliver this form

Fill out the form below and send it to **your county's address** on the back of this form, or take this form to the office of your County Board of Elections.

Mail or deliver this form at least **25 days before the election** you want to vote in. Your county will notify you that you are registered to vote.

### Verifying your identity

We'll try to check your identity before Election Day, through the **DMV number** (driver's license number or non-driver ID number), or the **last four digits of your social security number**, which you'll fill in below.

If you do not have a **DMV or social security number**, you may use a valid photo ID, a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or some other government document that shows your name and address. You may include a copy of one of those types of ID with this form—be sure to tape the sides of the form closed.

If we are unable to verify your identity before Election Day, you will be asked for ID when you vote for the first time.

# Registration Form:

## Choosing a Political Party – Question 14

- LWV urges all NY voters to enroll in the political party of their choice
  - New York state has a '**closed primary**' system = you have to be a member of that party to vote in its primary elections
  - Registering with one of the two main parties that hold primaries allows voters to vote twice as much each year because they can vote in that party's primary elections
  - Primary elections are where many of the real electoral choices and voter influence are in NYC!

***Vote and the Choice is Yours;  
Don't Vote and the Choice is Theirs.***

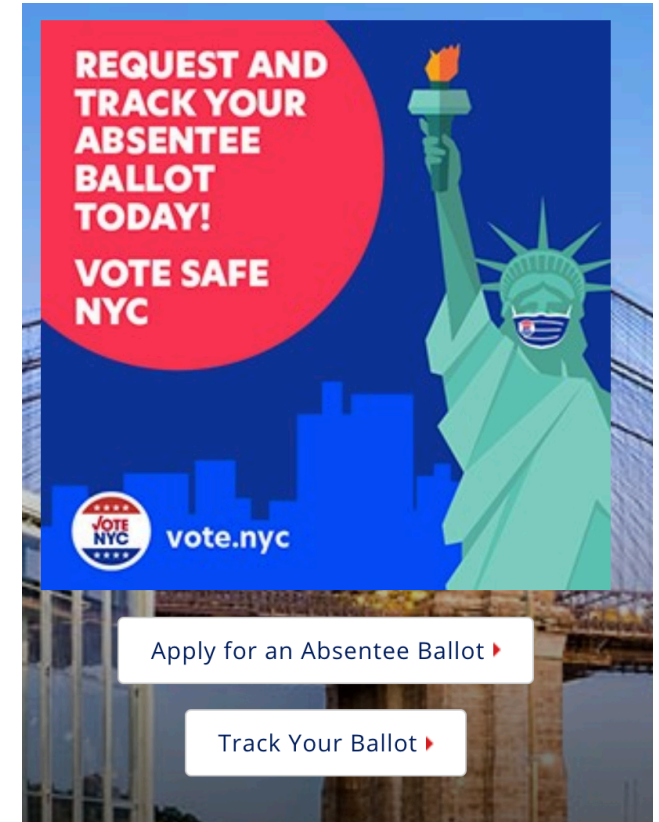
# Absentee Voting

- Ballots will be mailed out beginning 9/18
- When you receive the ballot, complete it and then *either*
  - Mail it via USPS to the BOE in your borough, postmarked by 11/03 *OR*
  - Hand deliver it to the BOE in your borough (yourself or through a trusted source) *OR*
  - Hand deliver it to a poll site in your borough during Early Voting or on Election Day (yourself or through a trusted source) –
  - New! Dropboxes



# Absentee Voting – Tracking

- After you apply for an absentee ballot, you can track it
- Search by confirmation code or by voter information
- Works for both paper and electronic applications





# Absentee Voting – New Legislation on Challenges

- Voters must receive notice if their ballot is being challenged because of an issue with their signature or witness declaration
- Voters would be alerted by email, phone and/or mail depending on the ability of personal information
- Voters have 5 days to respond to address the challenge in the 2020 election, 7 days after that





# Early Voting

- First used in NY in November 2019 election
- When to vote early:
  - Any of the nine (9) scheduled days prior to each Election Day:
    - Before every Election Day: two weekends plus the week in between  
*OR* The 10 days before minus the Monday before E-Day
- Early Voting poll sites differ from Election Day poll sites!
  - Look up your poll site and hours: [nyc.pollsitelocator.com](https://nyc.pollsitelocator.com)
  - Just like on Election Day, you may only vote at your designated poll site
  - Times vary by day: early morning, daytime, and evening hours all available but on different days
- Early voting = socially distanced voting



# Voting Plan: Which option is best for you?

- You definitely need to vote by absentee ballot
- You are not sure if you will need to vote by absentee ballot - it will depend on your situation and local public health conditions.
- You prefer to go to the polls in person, and feel confident that you will be able to do so, consider voting early.
- You want or need to vote in person on Election Day

*Let's take a look at each of these in detail*



# 1. You need to vote by absentee ballot

- **Apply for an absentee ballot ASAP** (before October 27<sup>th</sup>)
  - Call 1-866-VOTE-NYC or online: <https://nycabsentee.com/>
  - For COVID-19, even if you have never been sick, use “Temporary Illness”
- **When you get the absentee ballot in the mail**
  - Follow the instructions carefully (ask questions as you need to)
  - Fill it out, sign and date it, and and seal it (NO glue or tape)
- **Return the completed ballot:**
  - **NOTE:** Someone else can mail or hand-deliver your ballot for you
    - Schedule this in advance with a trusted person
  - **Hand-Delivery** to either
    - Board of Elections office in your borough/county
    - Poll site, including early voting poll sites, in your borough/county
  - **Mail** (postage is not included)
    - Must be postmarked by Monday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>



## 2. You are unsure if you will need to vote by absentee ballot

For you, it will depend on your situation and local public health conditions.

Follow all the absentee instructions previous slide, but if:

1. The absentee ballot is slow in coming, and/or
2. You are uncomfortable with the process for completing and/or returning the ballot, AND
3. You feel able...

**Consider voting early!**



### 3. **Vote Early: you prefer to go to the polls in-person, but want to avoid crowds**

#### **Early Voting is much less crowded than voting on Election Day**

- Early voting is available nine days before Election Day - the two weekends before and the week in between, but not the Monday before Election Day
  - *For 2020:* October 24<sup>th</sup> – November 1st
- Information is on the BOE website [vote.nyc](https://www.vote.nyc)
  - Hours vary by day, with early morning and evening hours
  - Early Voting poll sites usually differ from Election Day poll sites
- Must wear a mask inside all BOE poll sites & offices



## 4. In-Person on Election Day

- Make sure your registration is current; if not re-register with the current information
- Look up your poll site
  - Information is on the BOE website [vote.nyc](https://vote.nyc.gov)
- Polls are open 6:00am – 9:00pm
- Must wear a mask inside all BOE poll sites and offices
- Leave extra time – lines can get long!
- Never leave without voting, even if it's after the poll closing time



# Affidavit Ballots (Just in Case)

- For registered voters who go to the correct poll site BUT for some reason they are not provided a paper ballot, **never leave without voting**
  - Ask to vote on an **affidavit ballot** ←←←
- Saying this term is legally triggering: poll workers must allow you to cast your vote via affidavit



# One more thing: Census 2020

- The Census population count is what determines how much of the ~ **\$1 trillion** in Federal funding for critical social, health, education, and infrastructure programs each state gets for the **next ten years**
- Determines allocation of representatives in Congress and state and local offices
- Answers are completely confidential as revealing any information is a felony
- To respond go to [My2020census.gov](https://my2020census.gov) or **844-330-2020**
  - Anyone who left NYC temporarily should respond to the census based on their “usual residence” – where they normally would have been on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020
  - Use your address if you don’t have a CensusID
  - Some households received a paper form, but everyone can do it online
- Follow up door-knocking begin August 11; **count ends September 30, 2020**
